This 1919 Nichols and Shepard steam traction engine was donated to the Farm Museum by the Guichon Family near Merritt. Museum volunteers loaded her up and brought her home!

The Guichon family has played a huge role in shaping BC's cattle industry. The Guichon brothers left France in 1858 to join the Fraser River Gold Rush. The brothers came upon the amazing grasslands of the Nicola Valley and began ranching. One brother moved to Delta and his family farmed there.
